Praise be Jesus Christ... Now and Forever!

Thank you for your time, your commitment, and your generous spirit in preparing such a meaningful gathering.



I also want to thank RE Faith Formation for sponsoring this fellowship and all the students, parents and parishioners who helped in any way—through hospitality, setup, cleanup, prayer, or presence. Your participation made this celebration truly special. Thank you to all who joined us to honor and thank Mary Ann and Mimi for their many years of faithful dedication to Mary Queen of Heaven Parish. Your presence and your words of gratitude were a touching reminder of how deeply loved and appreciated they are within our community.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the final Sunday in the liturgical year. This feast invites us to reflect on the kingship of Christ—not a kingship of earthly power or domination, but a reign founded on truth, mercy, and sacrificial love. Christ reigns from the Cross, showing us that true authority is expressed through service and compassion.

As we conclude Ordinary Time, this solemnity invites us to look back with gratitude for God's presence throughout the year and forward with hope as we prepare to enter Advent. Christ the King reminds us that no matter what we face, we belong to a kingdom of love that cannot be shaken. His reign brings peace to our hearts and direction to our lives.

May this celebration renew our commitment to follow Christ more closely and to build His kingdom through our words, actions, and relationships. As we begin Advent next week, let us prepare our hearts to welcome the King who comes not with force, but with humility; not with fear, but with hope; not with judgment, but with mercy.

May Christ the King reign in our homes, our parish, and our hearts.

STOP ASSISTED SUICIDE IN ILLINOIS!

SB 1950 has now passed the Illinois General Assembly and is awaiting decision by Governor Pritzker as to whether he will sign it into law. Please telephone the Governor at 312-814-2121 or 312-814-2122 and ask him to veto the bill.

- Just letting the Governor know your opposition is important. And here are some talking points you may also wish to offer:
- Legalizing assisted suicide gives doctors the right to be involved with causing the death of their patients at the most vulnerable times of their lives.
- Assisted suicide is not about freedom or choice. Culturally and medically, it abandons people when they need care, not death.
- A caring culture supports compassionate and appropriate end of life care and not assisted suicide.
- Suicide is always tragic, and legalizing assisted suicide lets other people become directly involved with the suicide act, sometimes for selfish and self-serving reasons.

Feel free to share your own personal story or a story about people you know of. And tell the Governor that the disability community opposes assisted suicide—and for good reason. Legalizing assisted suicide promotes death, not living with dignity.

Please help to promote a culture of life in Illinois, not a culture of death.
