A Message from Fr. Sunny

Ask Father Sunny

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Time and again, I would do a bulletin article answering some questions that parishioners (or even non-parishioners) ask me in all kinds of conversations and settings. When I feel that the questions might be relevant to the rest of the community, I make a mental note to include it in this forum of Question and Answer. So here are some questions that people have asked, with the corresponding responses that I have given:

QUESTION #1: Why do I need to go to confession... I can talk to God directly? Why would I tell my sins to a priest, who is also a human, and a sinner, like me?

ANSWER # 1: Then why would Jesus tell his apostles to forgive sins? Read Jn. 20:23. It shows that as the body of Christ, the church has authority to "represent" Christ in forgiving sins or withholding the forgiveness of sins. When a penitent goes to confessions, it is not the priest that he/she encounters but Jesus Christ, and the priest is there "in persona Christi." Confession is not about the righteousness of the priest. It is about what God is doing to the penitent in spite of the church. This is a very important Catholic teaching, that we go to confession for the forgiveness of sins, especially the mortal ones, that damage our relationship and communion, with God. Unlike other types of Christian theology that only take into account an EXCLUSIVE relationship with God and the individual person, confession also considers the relationship of the penitent with the rest of God's family, the Church, which is also affected by our individual sins.

QUESTION #2: Is refusing to take medicine TECHNICALLY CONSIDERED suicide?

ANSWER #2: Suicide is a deliberate intention to end one's life. If you are refusing medicine with an intention to die, then it is suicide. But some people do not want to take medicine for many other reasons, including the fact that some medicine may have terrible side effects and a person may not want those side effects. Others may simply feel tired of taking medicine. Still others may not be convinced that the medicine is making any real difference in their general wellbeing. These are just some of the other possible reasons why a person refuses medicine. As my professor in Moral Theology used to say back in Mundelein Seminary, "Sin is in the will..."

QUESTION #3: WHAT IS GOING ON WITH OUR DIOCESE; WHY ARE THE CHURCHES IN JOLIET CLOSING? WILL MARY QUEEN CLOSE?

ANSWER #3: If you want the full details of everything going on in our diocese, you need to go back to the first messages of Bishop Hicks when he started as our Bishop here in the diocese. After a thorough independent study of the diocese, it was identified that there is a need to do a targeted restructuring of our parishes. The bishop called it "pruning" IN ORDER THAT WE CAN BETTER BEAR FRUIT AS A CHURCH. For many who are privy to the status of the churches in Joliet, it is easy to say that this restructuring is overdue; it could have been done even twenty years ago. Feel free to check out the video messages of Bishop Hicks. He has been very thorough about everything that he is implementing and initiating for the diocese. I am confident that in the third and final year of the restructuring, our parish will remain and continue to grow. Let us not be complacent. We need to continue to find ways to grow and be relevant to families and communities in our area. We need to be missionary; we need to evangelize, and we need to be active in ministry. We are financially stable as a parish and our numbers have been growing. So, the trend tells us that we have more than enough reason to remain open and continue the story of faith here at Mary Queen of Heaven. So help us, God. Amen.

She become a lay Dominican and served the sick and the imprisoned until her death at the age of thirty-


