

A Message from Fr. Sunny

LET'S PRAY FOR JOLIET

Our diocese is in the midst of the observance of the 75th anniversary of her foundation. It is joyous, momentous, and truly inspirational in every way. The spirit of our celebration is faced with the reality of the church today, that is, we are continuing to ask how we can be a better church that proclaims Jesus Christ in our time. Sometimes, as the Bishop has boldly taught us, it may mean that this time is a time of pruning, a time of looking at the hard reality of our church in order that new life can grow in the process.

My dear parishioners, I ask you to pray for sixteen parishes in the Joliet Deanery. The announcement was recently made, after a thorough time of discerning, listening, praying, changing, creative readjusting, reevaluating, and the like. The process, I must say, is not easy, and it took into consideration the many voices of people. I was part of the final steps of the process, which was a solemn meeting with the Board of Consultors of the Bishop where I am a member, and the Presbyteral Council where I am serving as current chair. I was in both meetings while in the Philippines, which given the time difference, meant that I was awake and attentive from 1:00 AM to 5:00 AM. During the meeting, even though I was on the other side of the world, I felt so spiritually connected with the diocese, a sense of being in a process which will change the spiritual lives of people. Unintentionally, it brought back memories of many meetings and sleepless nights of discerning and praying that I had to do when I was tasked to close three parishes and start a new one within four months. I can commiserate with the losses in many ways, and I know that most of us can, because we can imagine what it might be like to lose something very intimately connected with one's spiritual growth together with the stories of many families who built community in that one church. And when we talk about losses and emotional matters, it does not always matter whether the reasons are valid, or it has been a long time coming. The process of grieving must take place, no matter what.

That is why it is crucial that the rest of us in the diocese pray for those affected by these changes. Let us pray that good things may truly come out of it, and that it reawakens us all to deeper devotion to the church and the practice of our faith. May the convenient and challenging paths of the road both bring us closer to accomplishing the ideals of our diocese as founded in faith, while called to witness now and in the future and to continue to be sent forth to serve.

God bless our diocese, God bless the faithful, God bless the Church!






