

A CHRISTMAS TO REMEMBER...

A blessed Epiphany Sunday to you all, my dear MQH parishioners!

How has your Christmas Season been? I pray that you have been given the opportunity to focus on the most important parts of the Christmas celebration — the part where we contemplated about the love of God and the ways that God blesses us every day in order that we may sustain ourselves in our ministerial responsibilities. I hope you had the chance to have some silence and reflected on all the moments with your heart.

Director of Catechesis and Evangelization, Michael Lewandowski, will present on the life of St. Isaac Jogues. Born to a prosperous family in France in 1609, his desire was to bring the Gospel far and wide as a Jesuit missionary. He first ministered among the Hurons in Canada. Fr. Jogues struggled to spread the Gospel in the New World. He bore much suffering and danger, and witnessed terrible torture. However, his zeal and love for souls would eventually bear fruit.

Fr. Jogues returned to France after being captured and tortured by the Mohawks. He eventually left France once more to again minister in the New World, where he was martyred. He was canonized in 1930, along with the seven other North American Martyrs.


