GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR

THOUGHTS ON THE STATE OF THE PARISH REPORT 2022-2023

Every year, since I have arrived at Mary Queen of Heaven in 2020, I offer the State of the Parish Report this season to wrap up the previous fiscal year. I am proud to present this third report, grateful to the Lord for everything we were able to accomplish together as a community of faith. What does the report say?

BABY STEPS ARE GOOD. I can immediately see the comparisons of the three years, and it shows that we have grown a little, here and there. A slight increase in number of parishioners shows that there are new people in our community, in fact I know some of them personally. now, because they have since been involved in our ministries.

MAINTAINING AND IMPROVING IS INVESTING FOR OUR FUTURE. The last fiscal year saw some investments in improving our facilities. Thanks to the continued generosity of the Greco Family, we were able to convert the conference room 13 into a much more efficient, hospitable and warm space. The room is now renamed as Greco Room, recognizing the legacy of the Greco family, who laid the foundations of the parish with Fr. O'Keefe back in 1949. Bishop Ron Hicks did a simple blessing of this room together with some of the Greco family back in April 2023. Deacon Matt has also been busy with all kinds of maintenance work for our buildings, thanks to the ongoing process in our diocese to have a thorough study of our church campuses to ensure vitality of our operations in the future. Our Finance Council has been very diligent in study-ing our outputs and we continue to find ways of creating a buffer fund that will be used as a seed for bigger building expenses in the future.

WE ALWAYS NEED MORE VOLUNTEERS. We have many initiatives and ministries, and for a smaller parish like ours, it requires a higher percentage of parishioners to be involved in ministry. I will never tire of inviting people to participate and do their small tasks to contribute to the dynamism of our parish. If everybody is simply satisfied with going to Sunday mass, then our parish would stop existing. In some degree, coming to Sunday mass is our participation. Just by going to mass on Sunday, we will never deepen our understanding of our faith, we will never get to build a loving and supportive community atmosphere, and our clergy will never be able to satisfy all the need of the community. That is why, together with the report, I always emphasize the gratitude I feel for our parishioners who go the extra mile to volunteer and participate in ministry, hoping that others will be inspired to do the same.

GOD IS IN THE DETAILS. Whatever we may accomplished last year, I want to say "Thank you, Lord!" God has been good to us, and we are here, continuing our mission to the people of our parish, and to the world. God provides the big picture, which we can easily see in the report. But God is even more keenly present in the details, the very working of the Spirit that will never make it to the report, nor spoken in such great details. To our parishioners and family who did the simplest gesture of encouragement, service, kindness, initiative, joy and charity, THANK YOU. I may not know all those details, as your pastor, but I look to God in prayer to ask Him for His abundant blessings to all of you. I then bring this report to the altar of the Lord with all these sentiments of pride for our parish. And as we say in the Philippines, "Mabuhay, Mary Queen!"

CONGRATULATIONS

On the occasion of my 50th anniversary as a Church musician, Fr. Sunny has asked me to say a few words about these 50 years.

My musical life actually goes back to my parents; my father who had a great baritone voice and directed the parish choir back in Minneapolis, and my mother who always prayed that her son would one day play the organ in church. My sisters told me that as a youth I would imitate musical jingles and themes I heard on the TV.

While I played French horn in the grade school band, I did not play keyboard until high school, a later start. I played organ in a rock group in high school, honing my ear training by picking out my organ part from a long-playing record. I took lessons from a well-known jazz musician, Alan Swain before entering DePaul University in 1972 where I had an emphasis on music composition.

In 1973, my mother came across an ad for a church organist in the Catholic *New World*. I became the organist and director of a small choir at St. Rose of Lima Church on south Ashland Avenue in Chicago.

Thanks to the pastor, Fr. Edward Slattery, who became Bishop of Tulsa, I was fortunate to attend the First Archdiocesan Choral Festival of Chicago, which inspired me with the choral music, but more so with the huge unison of the congregation. After that I wanted to imitate that sound whenever I could.

He sent me to a GIA seminar in Cleveland for church musicians with Bob Batistini and Richard Proulx, two well-known church musicians who taught us how to lead a congregation with the organ. It was the foundation of my playing from then onward.

After five years at St. Rose of Lima, I got a job at Lowery Organ and spent the next five years as a substitute at 20 churches in Chicago. This gave me a wealth of experience with different organs, clergy and congregational music aids. I followed up with a tenure as music director of St. Jos-



peh's in Aurora, at which time my music was published by GIA Publications. I was also a composer, arranger, organist and pianist for *Chicago Prayer*, a church music ensemble of singers and instrumentalists. Here I honed my skills as an arranger.

I later worked at St. Francis Xavier in La Grange with Daniel Coughlin as pastor, who later became the chaplain for the U.S. House of Representatives. I

composed and arranged for a musical based on the Nativity called *at Bethlehem's Door*, where I honed my skills as a song writer. This was the brain child of Barbara Kales, one of my cantors at St. Francis, who also contributed songs to the musical. We performed the play at various churches in the 90's.

In 1993, I got what was at the time my dream job, music director at St. Barbara's in Brookfield, Bob Batistini's former position. I directed three choirs, played a full Mass schedule and led music for vespers during Advent and Lent. I was able to use the full range of my skills. I served for 13 years.

For the past 15 years, I have been here at Mary Queen of Heaven where I have worked for three pastors. I fully expect to be here until I pass. I don't expect to retire unless I become disabled, so don't get anxious.

Since I have never been married, I thank God for the Gift of creativity and inspiration to sustain me. It is always hard to determine how much is God and how much is me. I suspect I won't know this until I pass through the veil.


