## A Message from Fr. Sunny

#### LET'S GET LENT-READY

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday! Let's get ready for Lent, my dear church!

We can begin discerning how to make our Lenten season fruitful and meaningful by mapping out a plan of action. You see the spiritual life is very much about intentionality, of strategic action. Perhaps the following guide questions can help us all better prepare for this holy season:

- 1. What would you give up this lent? Work on a real sacrifice, not just a convenient one. Think about what you give up in terms of your spiritual life and don't mix it with other agenda like weight loss or saving money. It is important to know the spiritual value of what you are giving up, and to be single-minded about that reason.
- 2. What prayer forms would you commit yourself to praying during lent? There are many prayer forms, and sometimes, having too much in the plan may be discouraging or unrealistic. I suggest that we choose three prayer forms, at most. Choose three of the many, not including mass. Is it the rosary, the stations of the cross and daily scripture readings? It can also be a meditational resource, perhaps a Lenten book of reflections, including the one we offer in church or something you might find online or in a Catholic app on your phone. The resources are abundant.
- **3.** Who are the people you would invite to go to mass with? The Lenten season is also a great time to reconnect with friends and family, by inviting them to pray with you at mass. It is one of the most effective ways to enrich one's relationship. Already, we know what happens when a family prays together, but it is also true with friends. Would the Lenten season be such a meaningful time if you are able to bring one person in your life closer to Jesus?
- 4. Which spiritual struggle would you focus to resolve during this time? There are many aspects of our spiritual battles, and some of them may be collectively overwhelming to even begin to work on. The Lord understands our spiritual struggles and patterns of sin. Perhaps, this time, offer to the Lord one struggle. Just one to start with. After all, a journey of a million miles begins with just one step. Take the first step by choosing to work on one point of struggle. Keep it simple. Is it a bad habit of the mind? Is it a tendency to lose control of one's tongue? Is it a lack of discipline with food or shopping? Is it an unhealthy sexual habit? Whatever this one step might be, look at it closely and make a clear plan to resolve it with the help of God during this season. Small steps in the spiritual life do great wonders in the soul!
- 5. How will you exercise charity during this season? The "giving up" aspect of the Lenten discipline is balanced by the more pro-active call to charity, to do something good for others in the name of the sacrifice of Jesus. We tend to think of charity in monetary terms but that is just one of the many ways by which charity is expressed. Other ways of charity is the sharing of one's time and talent. In many cases, it is easy to dole out money to charitable causes, but the immediate opportunity might be right there by your nose. It can be spending more time in conversation with your family. It can be helping someone by using your special skills or talents. It can be using your time to reach out to people who need encouragement. The possibilities are endless.

May these questions help in preparing us for Lent. As we position ourselves to the holy season, it is my prayer that our intentionality may be coupled with God's fervor and auspiciousness. God bless our church. God bless you!



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Throughout his pontificate, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has often spoken of the need for Christians to evangelize others through accompaniment. Through listening patiently, building trust, and being mindful of others' dignity, we can help one another encounter Christ's merciful love, especially those who suffer from emotional wounds, loneliness, and doubt. For Central and Eastern Europeans living in countries that experienced 70 years of communist oppression, the Church especially needs to accompany people to an encounter with Christ that is patient, understanding, and filled with hope instead of fear, anger, and anxiety.

In Slovakia, the Alexis Counseling Center has accompanied nearly 2,500 women and their loved ones with devotion. Since 2010, the center has provided counseling to women experiencing the anxieties of an unplanned pregnancy or the grief of pregnancy loss, as well as to their partners, family members, and friends. In addition to promoting psychological healing, the center also helps vulnerable women who have experienced miscarriages and abortions to find housing, material and financial assistance, and support groups.



In Albania, lay people are preparing for lay ministries as catechists and extraordinary

ministers of Communion through a three-year study program that provides in-depth knowledge of the Gospel, the Church, and sacraments, liturgy, and spirituality. This formation program equips participants to be active, faith-filled agents of evangelization and accompaniment to those who desire to know Christ and the Church.

Ministries of accompaniment such as these are made possible with grant monies raised through the Ash Wednesday Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. When you participate in the collection, you help the Church in Slovakia, Albania, Ukraine and more than 24 other countries accompany people who still experience the hardships and wounds caused by communism. Your support for and promotion of the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe is crucial to the success of ministries that affirm the dignity of children, youth, and other vulnerable people and show them the love and mercy of Jesus.
