A Message from Fr. Sunny

A PEOPLE OF CELEBRATION

In the Philippines, celebration is a way of life. People are always looking for reasons to gettogether and celebrate, eat together, sing, take tons of pictures, wear your best clothes, put on a great smile and be ready to mingle with your favorite people. This is why the Philippines is called "The Fiesta Islands". Every island has its own celebration, featuring its own products and its own dishes and patron saints, its own regional flavors and sounds. There is so much pride given to celebrating well. But here at Mary Queen, we too, are a people of celebration.

Today, NOVEMBER 19, we celebrate Ed Novak's 50th anniversary as a liturgical musician. It is a special milestone, for sure. Being a liturgical musician is itself a calling, a specific path to serve the church, and it requires specific talents and skills, but also a proper understanding of what takes place during Mass. It requires a collaborative leadership and an ability to breathe the Holy Spirit in the songs and music pieces that are used in liturgy. Ed Novak has served as liturgical musician in various parishes in the Chicagoland area, and here at Mary Queen, since Fr. Tony Taschetta was the pastor. This weekend, we celebrate him and give thanks to God for his ministry. We pray that God continues to guide him to use his gifts for the glory of His Name.

On Tuesday, NOVEMBER 21, I will be celebrating my 51st birthday. As years roll by, I feel more and more how life is like being on a rollercoaster ride. While it is full of exciting turns, loops, twists and drops, it is also happening fast, and in the story of my life, I am at a place where I am seeing the bigger picture more than ever before. I feel more resigned to the way life unfolds, and I feel free to let go the things that I have no control over. As a priest, I have become keenly aware of human reality, both its blessings and challenges, making me both more grateful and more aware of how much I need God. I ask for your prayers, my dear parishioners, that my life may be a blessing to others.

On Thursday, NOVEMBER 23, we will all celebrate Thanksgiving Day with our families and community. It is one of the most meaningful civic holidays in this country, and I find that it needs to be celebrated more than ever before, as our culture is plagued by an attitude of entitlement. I pray that this Thanksgiving Season, the heart of America will return to the One-to-Whom-All-Thanksgiving-is-Due.

On Saturday, NOVEMBER 25, we begin a special novena to St Francis Xavier, which also marks the beginning of our diocesan celebration of the 75th Jubilee of the establishment of the Diocese of Joliet. It is a very momentous occasion for our local church to celebrate that we are "founded in faith, called to witness and sent forth to serve." As we enter into the jubilee year with this novena, let us pray that the Joliet Diocese will continue the work of saving souls and bringing the Gospel of Jesus.

There are many reasons to celebrate, and indeed, we are a church that celebrates. Let us sing our praises to God and fill our hearts with the joy of knowing that we are beloved by God. Celebrate, dear Church, come on!





Bishop Hicks' Column

LAUNCHING OUR 75TH JUBILEE





A "JUBILEE" IS A SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY, marking a certain time period. For example, a twenty-fifth anniversary is universally recognized as a silver jubilee, whereas the fiftieth is known as the golden jubilee. This month, we are officially launching the 75th Anniversary of the Diocese of

Joliet, or the celebration of our diamond jubilee.

As they say, "diamonds are forever." This celebration gives us the opportunity to honor our past, commemorate our present, and look forward to the future with hope. Our year-long celebration will officially begin in December 2023 and end in December 2024. However, we have a few things happening in November that I would like to share with you and encourage your participation.

On Monday, November 6, 2023, we launched the first episode of a 14-part podcast series produced specifically for our 75th anniversary. In our pilot episode, Fr. Tom Paul, the chair of the Jubilee planning committee, and I talked about different ways that you can participate in our anniversary celebration. If you are a podcast afficionado, just listen on your favorite app by searching "Faith Into Action." Or you may try watching it on the diocesan YouTube channel. Either way, the links can always be found in the 75th Anniversary section of our website, **diojoliet.org/75th**, which can be read in English, Spanish, and Polish.

As we celebrate with great faith, hope, and love, I want to make sure we have many opportunities to pray together. A nine-day novena will begin on November 25, the Saturday after Thanksgiving. This Novena of Grace is based on the writings of the patron saint of our diocese, St. Francis Xavier. For daily prayers and devotions, visit the website or see your Sunday bulletin.

The novena concludes on December 3, 2023. On that same day we will host an event at the Blanchette Catholic Center at 1 p.m., where I will bless a new statue of St. Francis Xavier. He will beautifully welcome employees and visitors at the main entrance to our diocesan offices to remind us of our missionary call to share our faith with all people.

Then, for an entire year we will celebrate in ways that highlight my vision of catechesis, evangelization, and faith into action:

- We will promote **catechesis** through faith formation to help the next generations *know about* Jesus and the Church. Through novenas, prayer cards, and lesson plans, we will grow the knowledge of our faith for all ages. We are blessed that our celebration is occurring in harmony with the threeyear National Eucharistic Revival, which reminds us how the Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives.
- 2. We will also continue to **evangelize**, which is needed to truly know Jesus and *love* Him. True evangelization is realized when we believe in our minds, hearts, and souls that Jesus is real: He loves us, and we love Him. Through liturgies, prayers, media posts, podcasts, printed calendars, and commemorative books, we will actively **share** our faith and love of Jesus, who gives us eternal life through His life, suffering, death, and resurrection.
- 3. With catechesis and evangelization as our foundation, we will continue to put our **faith into action**. As Catholics, we *serve* the poor, the needy, and the marginalized. We speak for the unborn, the stranger, the abandoned, and those who are in most need of our care. As part of the 75th anniversary, I encourage all parishes to establish a day of service in the fall of 2024, responding to the various needs of each distinct community.

Jesus gave us such an incredible gift in the Church, and as baptized Christians, we are called to pass our faith on to the next generations. No one wants to belong to a Church that is merely surviving. Instead, we should have a burning desire to be a thriving Church that truly reflects God's light and God's love.

I encourage you to participate in some aspect of our 75th Jubilee during this next year. There is truly something for everyone, and I want each of you to know that YOU are a vital part of our celebration. So, together, rooted in Christ, let's live out the theme of our 75th anniversary: founded in faith, called to witness, and sent forth to serve!
