

A Message from Fr. Sunny

NEVER STOP LEARNING

Never stop learning. That is one fundamental lesson I got from my grandfather. When we stop learning, it means that we are stagnating, and when we stagnate, we die.

My grandpa Marcelino was an avid reader. He read every day and played the crossword every day with such loyalty. He was always curious about new things, he would dismantle a transistor radio and assemble it all back together. He always wanted to know how things worked, including the computer and the video games when Mario and Mario Cart were famous. He was a sucker for intellectual stimulation. This was probably the reason why my grandpa had a very clear and sharp mind until the end of his life.

My dear friends and family at MQH, it is in the name of my grandpa that I invite you to learn about our faith, and to continue your search for God, albeit only in small concrete steps. There are many ways by which this could be done, including your participation in the OCIA as a form of Catholic Review. (We have several parishioners who are doing the program now!) Another way would be by picking up an encyclical by one of the popes. There is of course the Focolare Bible Sharing Group that happens very month here in our parish. We have a small but pretty good collection of books at the Greco Room, where you are welcome to sit and lounge when the room is available.

Being in the Philippines, I get to appreciate what it means to deepen my knowledge and experiential learning of the land of my birth. While I was born here, I have never really visited many of the islands of this archipelago. This year's first pilgrimage to the Philippines with Fr. Mario and Fr. Dindo allowed us all to get to know the Philippines better. Having visited many churches in central Philippines along with participating in the Sinulog Festival of the Infant Jesus, I became more aware of the unique Catholicism that we have in this country. I got to learn the history of Christianity in this part of the world and have immersed myself in the culture of worship and devotion. The Filipinos in Cebu put up shrines upon shrines of the Infant Jesus in front of their homes and storefronts, including restaurants and big office buildings in the city. It is also amazing to see that there are at least two statues of the Infant Jesus for every household, and these statues are carried every year into the streets for dancing and praying. I come home to Elmhurst richer in my knowledge and appreciation of my faith and my roots.

I pray that by our passion for learning, we all get to deepen our knowledge of Jesus Christ as a person in His divinity. After all, since we will never be able to exhaust everything to know about the Divine, we might as well try to get as close to it as we can. God bless our church!



Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has given Catholics in the United States an opportunity to share faith in unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout Latin America and the Caribbean islands.

The work of evangelization is carried out by Christians who meet people where they are—not only in a geographical sense but also in the context of culture. Though the Gospel is unchanging, we have many ways to make it relevant to people of all cultural, ethnic, and linguistic backgrounds.

The countries of South America have diverse populations from Indigenous, African, European, and Asian ancestries, all with different cultural experiences. By welcoming and understanding
