I am sure most of you will not be surprised if I told you that music and song is part of my spirituality. Singing has become an expression of my deepest spiritual insights, and my innermost realities in my spiritual life. Why not? Didn't St. Augustine say that singing is praying twice? If you would like to try incorporating song in your Lenten journey, here, in random order, are my suggestions of songs that will give you inspiration and prayerful insights during this season:

HE WILL CARRY YOU. *“If he carried the weight of the world upon His shoulder, I know my brother/sister that He will carry you.”* This song somehow takes me back to the *via dolorosa*, when Jesus walked the way of the cross, carrying the burden of our sins. It also somehow connects with a poem called “Footprints in the sand” which reminds us that when we are struggling, God carries us and never leaves us alone.

ABOVE ALL. *“Like a rose trampled on the ground, He took the fall and thought of me above all.”* The theology of God's love is that He put us first above anything else, including His Son. That is the essence of John 3:16. It is the icon of all love – to put the beloved ahead of oneself. That is the true and radical love that God teaches in the cross.

BE STILL, MY SOUL. *“Be still, my soul, thy best, thy heavenly friend; through thorny way leads to a joyful end.”* The entire lyrics is beautiful and poetic, but this line sums it all up. It reminds me of Jesus telling his apostles to stay with him and be awake even for an hour, to be still in the garden, when the tempest was about to pass. It tells us to be at peace in the midst of the trials, to be at peace in faith.

WE ARE THE REASON. *“We are the reason that He gave His life... to show us the reason to live!”* This song connects us back to Christmas and the ultimate self-giving of God, so that we too may learn to give. It is very inspirational and the lyricism is confident in faith.

HOSEA (COME BACK TO ME). *“Come back to me... long have I waited for your coming home to me and living deeply our new life.”* This is very familiar for Catholics. It is a beautiful song which reminds me of the Compassionate father waiting for his prodigal son to return home. God feels the same longing for the return of every sinner. How incredibly healing to think of God in this light.

HEALING. *“Coz your love just keeps on healing me, no matter how I bruise... I know that your love is healing.”* How beautiful to think of God's healing power found in His love. I remember playing this in my head when I was about to go to the operating room... I surrendered everything to God and just told Him that I will lie down in faith, for His love to heal me. It took away my pre-surgery anxieties.

HE (I FORGIVE): *“He can turn tide and calm the angry sea... though it makes Him sad to see the way we live, He'll always say ‘I Forgive’.”* Here is a song that states the basic truths about God. He is all powerful and yet He chooses to forgive. The ironic verses of the song get us to thinking about the mercy of God, compelling to do better.

There are so many beautiful songs that are so good for this season, but I will stop here. What's in your playlist? What moves you about those songs that touch on the themes of Lent? Let's sing in church, and sing in our inner sanctuaries, the truth of God, and our relationship with Him. Tell Him through song what happens in your heart. May this Lenten Season bring much joy for knowing the merciful love and generosity of God. Amen.

Born in 1287 in northern Italy to rich and powerful nobles, Margaret's birth was met with her parents' disgust and rejection, as she was born with numerous deformities. Eventually, out of fear of her discovery, Margaret's parents confined her to a cell connected to a church. It was here in the solitude of the mountains that she formed a profound and intimate relationship with God. She was later abandoned by her parents and left to fend for herself in a strange city. She would be taken in by beggars and then by various families. However, her holiness and deep love of God inspired and changed the hearts of those she encountered. She became a lay Dominican and served the sick and the imprisoned until her death at the age of thirty-three.

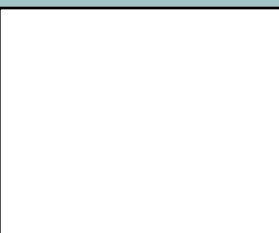
